WHAT IS C & B

C&B means **Charitable and Benevolent** and is a program to raise funds by means of a raffle, whereby both the state and local council benefit from the efforts exerted by the membership.

Each raffle book contains 12 chances, each selling for \$1.00. The completely sold book is to be returned to the local council. For each sold book the New York State Council must receive \$6.00. The remaining funds stay in the local council. This means the local council can earn as much as \$9.00 per sold book with the council bonus. Each local council may not charge more than \$1.00 per chance and must return \$6.00 per completely sold book to the New York State Council. Partially sold books will be turned in at an appropriate pro-rated basis. (\$.50 per sold chance.)

QUICK START

The Quick Start is strictly an incentive program for the sellers. On July 24, 2011 the New York State Council will conduct a Quick-Start seller's incentive, whereby all books sold and returned before July 24, 2011 will be eligible to participate in the Quick Start drawing.

TO BE ELIGIBLE THE FOLLOWING RULES APPLY:

1. Back covers will be used to determine winners.
2. Sold books must be sent in with back covers completely filled in with \$6.00 for each book sold.
3. All returns must be received prior to drawing date by first class mail or can be brought to the Crowne Plaza, Suffern N.Y. the weekend of July 22, 23, 24, 2011
4. Be sure back covers are filled out completely.
5. Under no circumstances can a local council's or home corporations name appear as the seller or purchaser of a book or ticket. If any such cover or ticket is drawn, it will be immediately disqualified and discarded.
6. All back covers must be mailed at least 10 days in advance of drawing to ensure they are entered in drum on July 24, 2011.
7. Returns will also be accepted in person at the District Deputies/State Officers Installation and orientation meeting at the Crowne Plaza.

THE NEW BONUS PLAN: HOW IT WORKS

First Goal: Reach (1/2) of books sold per member, the Council will receive \$1.00 back for each book sold until they reach Goal #2

Second Goal: Reach (2) books sold per member, the Council will receive \$2.00 back for each book sold from this goal on until they reach Goal #3

Third Goal: Reach (3) books sold per member, the Council will receive \$3.00 back for each book sold from this goal on.

No council is permitted to deduct its anticipated bonus from returns made to the state council during the course of the drive.

All goals are based on Supreme Membership Roster Numbers as of 7/1/2011

Bonus quotas will be published by the NY State Council C&B Committee as soon as available.

FINAL DRAWING

ROLE OF THE GRAND KNIGHT

The most single important action that a Grand Knight can take to assure the success of the C&B program is the appointment of the council Chairman.

The following criteria should be used when the Grand Knight is searching for the right man for this important position.

1. First and foremost he should be an active member who has past experience in the council and who is interested in the C&B program's success.
2. He must be willing to learn how the C&B program works and how it benefits the local council and the State council.
3. He must be a leader in your council, with plenty of enthusiasm, initiative and imagination. He must be ready to launch your program with new ideas and be able to motivate the members and their families into participating above average.
4. He must be able to audit and track members of books received, distributed, sold and account balance.
5. He must be able to attend council meetings and report to the membership the status of the program in the council. He may also be called upon to attend certain district, chapter, conference or state committee meetings.

It may be said that this type of a man is hard to find, but if you feel that this program can provide revenues for your council's charitable and other worthwhile functions, you will select the best man to develop your council's winning combinations.

After you have picked your chairman, you must give him your total support. See that he gets a good group of hard selling members on his committee. Attend all council C&B meetings and encourage everyone's participation.

ROLE OF THE COUNCIL CHAIRMAN

1. Select your committee and be particular in getting the enthusiastic member who believes in the benefits that C&B can give to your council and the State council.
2. Get acquainted with your Auxiliary Chairman assigned to your council. Make sure he has your correct name, address and telephone number.
3. To create competition, set up teams, within each team, include those members who are inactive in your council and get them involved with members who are active and enthusiastic in the C&B program.
4. Prepare messages to members via council bulletins and fliers at council meetings. Keep your member informed of the importance of the C&B program to your local council and the State council. From time to time you will receive letters and fliers from the State Committee. Feel free to copy them and have them available to your members.
5. Send each member at least one book and a letter explaining the importance of this program and encourage them to return the sold book as soon as possible. Enclose a self-addressed return envelope with your mailing.
6. Set up a telephone call list of members who fail to return the sold book within 10 days to two weeks. Personal contact works wonders!
7. Stimulate interest in your council with an Incentive Program. Give prizes for achievement, such as a hat with the K of C emblem on it or even a windbreaker. These items are available through the Supreme Council supply catalog and are reasonably priced. Remember we want to motivate participants. Use your creativeness and imagination. Remember, the more books sold, the more income for your council.
8. Sell at shopping plazas, supermarkets, sporting events, outside of your church after masses on Sunday or wherever people congregate. Remember you must receive permission from local businessmen and pastors before you can sell on their property.
9. Ask for help from your Columbiettes, Ladies Auxiliary, Squires, Squirettes and senior citizens.
10. Have his Council participate in the 2011 K.of C. Charity Day to receive maximum credit of books sold toward their C&B bonus \$\$\$\$\$.

ROLE OF THE STATE COMMITTEE

The State Committee is appointed by the State Deputy. The function of this Committee is to administer, organize, coordinate and see that the C&B program functions to provide revenue to the State and local councils to enhance their charitable and benevolent programs throughout New York and our order.

WHO ARE THE STATE COMMITTEE

STATE C&B DIRECTOR - Responsible for the overall administration of the program statewide, answers directly to the State Deputy.

STATE ASSISTANT TO C&B DIRECTOR – Responsible for all tasks assigned by the C&B Director in conjunction with his administration of the overall state program. He is to educate district and council leaders on the various activities that will promote C&B. He should also stress the partnership between the State Council and local Councils to the extent that councils will benefit financially from their participation in the program. The State Assistant Director will report to the State C&B Director.

STATE C&B SECRETARY-TREASURER - Responsible for distribution of books, fliers and status reports to local councils and State Committee personnel. All sold books are returned to the State C&B Secretary-Treasurer. He will record and deposit all funds into the State C&B checking account. He will prepare a year end report for the State Council Convention Book. The State Secretary-Treasurer will report to the State Deputy.

MAJOR CONFERENCE COORDINATOR - Responsible for all activities of the C&B Program in his Minor Conference areas. His primary function will be to organize a committee and promote the Statewide C&B program in his Conference areas. He will also ensure that his areas are serviced with sufficient supplies to conduct a successful program in his area. The Major Conference Coordinator will report to the State C&B Director.

MINOR CONFERENCE COORDINATOR - Responsible for all local council activities of his Conference. He will direct and report all activities of the Auxiliary Chairman assigned to him. He will ensure all local council chairman names are properly recorded with the State Director. He will also report the councils assigned to Auxiliary Chairman and to the State C&B Secretary. He will report to the Major Conference Coordinator. Keep account of books distributed to councils

STATE AUXILIARY CHAIRMAN - Responsible for activities at assigned local councils. He is responsible to maintain reports from local councils, monitor activity of the C&B Program in assigned councils and ensure local councils have adequate supplies to conduct the Program successfully. Keep account of books distributed to councils. He will be expected to attend District meetings. The Auxiliary Chairman will report to the Minor Conference Coordinator.

STATE VICE CHAIRMAN - Will assist Minor Conference Coordinator and Auxiliary Chairman; maintain a supply of C&B books and posters and attend District meetings.

WHAT DOES THE STATE COUNCIL DO WITH ITS SHARE

1. Pay all expenses affiliated with the C&B campaign, such as: cost of printing raffle books, posters, advertisement and promotion, prizes and awards, training of State Committee and Council Committee and any other associated program expenses.
2. Supports religious vocations and community activities throughout the state.
3. Supports youth programs (Squires, Free Throw, and Scholarships etc.).
4. Supports all Ordinaries throughout New York State in their diocesan programs.
5. Provides financial assistance for religious programs for the armed forces.
6. Provides financial assistance to combat indecent and immoral use of the media.
7. Supports many other charitable works of mercy when called upon to do so, such as disasters, floods, earthquakes, fires, health services research, homeless, feeding the poor, assisting people with disabilities, and cancer research, just to mention a few.
8. Supports State Pro-Life programs.
9. Supports all evangelization programs throughout the state.
10. Provides for disaster relief

WHAT DOES THE LOCAL COUNCIL DO WITH ITS SHARE

The printing of C&B Program posters and books are all made available to the local council at absolutely no cost to them. Their only expenses should be postage and mailing to their membership and any incentive programs they use to promote the program in their council.

Each council will use the revenue from the C&B program to promote any charitable and benevolent programs in their local areas where it would not be practical for the State Council to do so. Each council is responsible to keep financial records of revenue derived from this program and how the funds are dispersed. Each Council Chairman will be responsible to account for all books received from the State Council at the end of the program in December.

STATE COUNCIL RECOGNITION AWARDS

At the 2012 New York State Council Convention, those councils, which have attained outstanding status during the 2011 C&B Campaign, will be awarded suitable Recognition Awards.

The council that achieves the number 1 status in the categories listed will receive an award.
